

What We Believe

Dear Parishioners,

With every miracle that Jesus performs, something is revealed. In today's gospel passage, Jesus heals a deaf man who had a speech impediment. The location of where this takes place is very significant. Jesus moves from the Jewish territory of Tyre into the Gentile territory of the Decapolis. The people there already have some sense of faith since they bring the deaf man to Jesus to be healed. The Good News is not only received by the chosen People of God, but also by the Gentiles.

Jesus goes out of his way to make physical contact with the deaf man. It seems as though the miracle can only happen if Jesus puts his hand into the man's ear and his spit on the man's tongue with his hand. According to the Jewish purity code, this was a violation. It was forbidden to have physical contact with a Gentile. From this miracle then, we realize that Jesus was not afraid to break through cultural barriers or religious rules to include people of all nations into the Kingdom of God. With his heart and with his hands, Jesus embraces everyone. How blessed we are to be included as well. Like Jesus, may our hearts and hands be open to receive and embrace all of God's people regardless of who they are or where they come from.
