Pastor's Corner

What We Believe

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

As an orphan, I will never know who my birth parents are. It is just not possible. My adopted mother used to tell me when I was a wee lad how I was found in a field and brought to a Catholic orphanage in Inchon, Korea. Given my early beginnings, I have always had the issue of abandonment well into my adult years. It is something I have struggled with most of my life. There are certain experiences that trigger this sense of abandonment. When it happens, I feel so powerless and helpless. I feel overwhelmed. Fear overcomes me. But then there is my faith.

Thank God for my faith. I do not know where I would be without my faith. My faith has saved me in many ways. Today's gospel passage reminds me that I am not alone in life, that I am not abandoned. Even though I am an abandoned child and I will never know anything about my biological father and mother, I am not abandoned by God our Father.

Jesus mentions with great conviction that we are never abandoned or alone in life. Jesus emphatically says that the God the Father will love us. Also, God and he will come to us, and they will make their dwelling with us as long as we keep his word. Believing this with all my heart, I feel a deep sense of peace and gratitude. Human beings often fail us, even parents as well. God will never fail us. It is no wonder then that Jesus teaches us to call God our Father and to call Mary our Mother. As human beings, we have an innate desire to be loved by a father and mother. And so we are. We travel not alone in life. Our Father and Mother are with us always.

Preparation of the Gifts

In the last few months we have reviewed elements of the Liturgy of the Word. Now we move into the Liturgy of the Eucharist in our overview of the Mass.

While the Eucharist celebration was originally connected to a meal, certain practical difficulties arose with larger and larger numbers of participants and varied customs between Jewish and gentile Christians. Gradually, the Eucharist became separate from a meal and the sharing of the bread and wine were placed on the table together, consecrated in thanksgiving together, and shared together.

At the Preparation of the Gifts, formerly known as the Offertory, bread and wine are brought up to the altar as a way of focusing attention on these two elements of worship. In the Middle Ages this practice evolved into an elaborate recitation of prayers often known as the "Little Canon." Today the structure of this rite has been simplified to prepare the altar, the gifts, and the community for the sacrificial offering to come. The Preparation of the Gifts is really the "entering in" of the Eucharistic celebration.


