

Pastor's Corner

Dear fellow members of St. Denis and Our Lady of the Wayside,

Throughout the Gospel of Mark the guestion that lingers in the minds of the people who followed him was, "Who is this man?" In the Gospel reading of today Jesus cures a man with an unclean Spirit. The people who witnessed this miracle said that Jesus teaches as 'one having authority.' But the crowd was not able to know the source of his authority. The source of his authority is identified by an unlikely voice, the voice of the possessed man, "I know who you are – the Holy one of God." The identity of Jesus is again revealed at his crucifixion, by another unlikely voice, the voice of the Roman soldier who says, "Truly this man was the Son of God." Jesus was not just another good man, or holy man or good teacher. He is the 'Holy one of God, the Son of God.' If we could truly grasp the truth of who Jesus is, that knowledge would transform our lives!

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

Saint of the Week: St. Blaise

February 3 - We remember Saint Blaise's feast day because of the Blessing of the Throats that took place on this day. Two candles are blessed, held slightly open, and pressed against the throat as the blessing is said. Saint Blaise's protection of those with throat troubles apparently comes from a legend that a boy was brought to him who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. The boy was about to die when Saint Blaise healed him. Very few facts are known about Saint Blaise. We believe he was a bishop of Sebastea in Armenia who was martyred under the reign of Licinius in the early fourth century. The legend of his life that sprang up in the eighth century tell us that he was born in to a rich and noble family who raised him as a Christian. After becoming a bishop, a new persecution of Christians began. He received a message from God to go into the hills to escape persecution. Men hunting in the mountains discovered a cave surrounded by wild animals who were sick. Among them Blaise walked unafraid, curing them of their illnesses. Recognizing Blaise as a bishop, they captured him to take him back for trial. On the



way back, he talked a wolf into releasing a pig that belonged to a poor woman. When Blaise was sentenced to be starved to death, the woman, in gratitude, sneaked into the prison with food and candles. Finally Blaise was killed by the governor.

Blaise is the patron saint of wild animals because of his care for them and of those with throat maladies.
