## Pastor's Corner

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Today's Responsorial Psalm gives us something to contemplate for the coming week. We are called and invited to reflect upon these words: Here am I Lord, I come to do your will. This implies that we have the willingness to go to the Lord. Do we live for ourselves, or do we have an innate desire to live for God? When I was a wee lad, my mother and I would always sit in front of the tabernacle, which was located on the right side of the church. Occasionally, my mother would mention to me to give my life over to God.

Later in life, specifically when I was a freshman in college, I came to realize that giving my life over to God really meant surrendering my will to do the will of God. This involved discerning what God wanted me to do rather than doing what I wanted to do with my life. I prayed unceasingly for God to show me the way. He obviously revealed to me his will.

I can honestly say that in doing and living God's will is our peace and contentment. If you are seeking meaning and purpose in life and a sense of direction, then seek and do God's will in your life. Your hope and heart's desire will be fulfilled. The void you may feel deep down inside can only be filled with the presence of God. God's abiding presence is in us when we live for him, not for ourselves.

## What We Believe

**Have you ever had to testify about something?**

**Usually when we are called to testify to something, we have some direct knowledge and understanding about what it is that we are testifying about.**

**In a court case, a witness who is called to the stand is usually someone who either directly saw what happened or can speak to the character of the defendant or plaintiff.**

**This is called a character witness.**

**In today's Gospel reading from John,**

**John the Baptist testifies that Jesus is the Lamb of God.**

**Two times John mentions that he "did not know" Jesus.**

**Yet John testifies to who Jesus is for a couple of reasons.**

**First, John knows that he is preparing the way for the Lord.**

**Second, John testifies that he witnessed God's revelation,**

**the Holy Spirit, descend upon Jesus.**

**This profound experience leads John to state**

**that Jesus is indeed the Son of God**

**who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.**

**Even though John the Baptist "did not know" Jesus,**

**he still testifies to the power of God's love**

**in sending his Son to begin his earthly ministry.**

**We should not be afraid to testify to the work God is doing in our lives.**

**Share what it has meant to be a Christian.**

**Don't be afraid to go out and live your faith publicly.**

**Far too often, we are afraid of sharing our faith with others.**

**Take a chance and go out and speak boldly,**

**just as John the Baptist did in his day.**
