What We Believe

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Good to go. These words were instilled in me by Marine Corp drill instructor Staff Sargent Sears when I did my basic training for the navy in Newport, Rhode Island. Throughout my service in the military, we were constantly told to be good to go. Without a moments notice, we could be shipped off to war. We always had to be ready to go. When 911 happened, I received orders to go to the Middle East, specifically Bahrain then to Kuwait near the border of Iraq. My life was literally turned upside down. I went from being a parish priest to being on the front line in an instant. What happened to me is what happened to Abram in the first reading.

God ordered Abram to leave the land of his kinsfolk to go to a foreign land he was unfamiliar with. His life was turned upside down as well. It is quite a scary thing to face and experience the unknown, and to not be in control of one's life. That is how life is for a person of faith. God calls us forth, and orders us to go where he wants us to go. As Christians, we are challenged to be always ready to serve the Lord. Even as a priest, I still have to be good to go. As a servant of the Lord, I willingly put my life in his hands. I am charged to go where God wants and needs me to go. His will not mine be done.

If we are open to God's good to go orders, then good things can and will happen. Abram's openness to God's command of good to go led to receiving an abundance of God's blessings. Abram's descendants became as numerous as the stars in the sky. This was the very best blessing Abram could have ever received from God. I feel extremely blessed by God myself. Look at where I am today, here as your pastor. Be faithful to God and he will bless you. During this season of Lent, let us always be good to go.

I own a very colorful copy of a poster by brother Mickey O'Neill McGrath that illustrates a quote from St. Catherine of Genoa that says' "My deepest me is God." As we climb the mountains in our own lives let us seek to go deeper into ourselves to find the God who is ever seeking us.

Look around the church this season. You'll see lots of purple and the desert. Purple is the color of sorrow and repentance, and reminds us to examine our consciences and be sorry for our sins. The desert is where we join Jesus, confronting our temptations and focusing on our relationship with God, without distractions. The Holy Water has been removed too, as a sign of our desert experience, but it will return with the blessing of new water during the Easter Vigil celebration.
